1. Last date for submitting the abstracts is **11-12-2023 Monday 5.00 pm**
2. Presenting author must be a registered participant of the conference.
3. Presenting author must indicate whether the abstract is for the free poster / paper / or award poster/paper.
4. Abstracts must be original. They should not be or have been published or presented at any other meeting.
5. Abstract title to be limited to 20 words in BOLD UPPER CASE (Times New Roman font, size 14)
6. Text to be limited to 250 words for posters and 300 words for paper (Times new roman size 12) and is to be structured within the following headings
 - * Title
 - * Poster or Platform presentation
 - * Presenting author followed by coauthors names
 - * Email id for communication
 - * Institution Name, State
 - * Phone number & Passport Size Photo

If A Clinical Study

- * Introduction - Indicate the purpose and objective of the research.
- * Materials and Method - Describe the setting, location for the study, study design, study population, data collection and method of analysis used.

Abstract Guidelines

- * Results - Present as clearly and detailed as possible the findings / outcome of study, with specific results in summarized form.
- * Conclusion - Briefly discuss the data and main outcome of study.

If A Case Report

- * Introduction
 - * Case presentation
 - * Discussion
 - * Conclusion
7. Please do not include tables, graphs and images in the abstract.
 8. Abstract should be submitted online only.
 9. The presenting author is required to ensure that all co-authors are aware of the contents of the abstract before submission.
 10. The Scientific Committee has the right to accept or reject any presentation after peer review. The decision of the Scientific committee with regards to submitted abstracts shall be final.

Free Paper Presentation Guidelines

Observing Your Allotted Time

- The total time allotted to each presenter is 10 minutes,
- Key Speakers 10+2 minutes and Sponsors presentation 15 minutes.
- You should plan to speak during the allotted time and keep 1 minute for question and answer.
- There is NO EXCUSE for using more than your allotted time.
- KINDLY rehearse your presentation several times to make it within allotted time.
- It will be good for your audience, the Session Chair and the other speakers if you speak within your allotted time.
- The Session Chairs are instructed to adhere to the printed schedule for the session.
- Session chairs should inform presenters of the session type and length of presentations.
- With parallel sessions this is critical to the overall success of the conference.

Abstract Template

Abstract Title (Times New Roman 11pt, Bold, Spacing 10pt after)

- All abstracts will be blind reviewed-please do not add author, co-author names or affiliations.

Introduction (approx 75-100 words, Times New Roman, 9pt)

- Also called “Introduction”, this section describes the study’s relation to past research, rationale, and prepares for the aim,
- The Background starts with a general context and then leads towards the actual (clinical/technical/educational/...) problem that the study addresses.
- Also cite relevant previous works [#] (from one’s own or from others) to further direct the reasoning towards the aim. This section is used by reviewers to assess “relevance”.

Aim (approx. 30 words, Times New Roman, 9pt)

- The aim (or purpose, or, objective, or research question) is a concise statement of the goal, phrased in a precise way that was targeted by this study.

Method (approx 100 words, Times New Roman, 9pt)

- The method refers to how the study is designed and executed, by describing all the steps and selections that were made to fulfill the study’s aim and to allow the reader to critically appraise the results.
- For most clinical studies, this includes participant selection criteria, agenda for each person who took part, measurements and interventions that were performed; how the data was processed into the concepts mentioned in the aim, and statistical evaluation.
- For nonclinical studies, the structure is less straightforward but relevant details must be provided, especially if the method is (technological) innovative.

Abstract Template

Results (approx 130 words or less if you paste an image or insert a table, Times New Roman, 9 pt) Graph / Picture

- This section describes the actual results of your study. The main result should be presented in a manner that fits the way the aim of the study was phrased.
- It is encouraged to visualize the main results using a figure. Also, a table might be a concise way to present structured data. To ensure readability for figures and tables, please consider minimizing the amount of information included, avoid small font sizes, and no colours. Preferably describe your results in numbers and add statistical significance (p-values) if appropriate.

Discussion & Conclusion (approx 70, Times New Roman, 9pt)

- While the result section presents focused outcomes, the discussion provides interpretation of the results.
- Discussion relevant questions can include: “are there important study limitations?”, “do the results confirm or conflict with previous results?”, “are the result generalizable?”
- After all relevant considerations, a final conclusion must be written.
- This conclusion should relate to the aim and not overstretch the importance of the results.

References (optional, Times New Roman, 9pt):

- This is optional, but necessary if you build on previous work. Very short style is common in abstracts, meaning:

Guidelines For Poster Presentation

General Aim and Format :

- A poster is a graphically based approach for presenting research in presenting your research with a poster, you should aim to use the poster as a means for generating active discussion of the research.
- Limit the text to about one-fourth of the poster space and use “visuals” (graphs, photographs, schematics, maps etc.) to tell your story”.

Design and Layout Specifications :

- The poster must be 36 x 48 (915mmx1220mm) size. It will be mounted on a board. The poster does not necessarily have to fill the working area.
- The board must be oriented in the “Portrait” position (long a Dimension is vertical).
- Make it obvious to the viewer how to progressively view the poster. The poster generally should read from left to right, and top to bottom. Numbering the individual panels or connecting them with arrows is a standard “guidance system”.
- Divide the poster into columns (3-5 across depending on poster size)
- Use headings to identity sections.
- Avoid long stretches of text.
- Break up text with pictures, tables, figures, etc. For visual appeal and to save space, use graphics instead of text to illustrate points.
- Leave some open space at least 35% of your poster in the design An open layout is less tiring to the eye and mind
- Bring board pins or double sided tape to mount your poster.

Contents :

- Your Poster should attract viewers quickly within few seconds.
- A poster is not an enlarged journal article- be brief, concise and don't

overwhelm viewers with too much information.

- Use short sentences or bulleted text.

Standard Components :

- A banner displaying your poster title, name, and department (or class, if appropriate) should be positioned at top-centre of the poster. Typical headings:
 - Introduction
 - Methods
 - Results
 - Conclusions
 - References
 - Acknowledgement of funding source if applicable.

Style :

- Use Arial fonts for titles and headings.
- Use Times New Roman fonts for the body.
- Do not use all CAPS, as it is hard to read. Try to use “Sentence case”.
- Text should be legible from three to five feet away. Title font size should be about 100 points or larger and text 24 points or larger. However, font size is about judgment and what looks best with your poster.
- Graphs and tables should be large (minimum of 8.5 x 11 inches is preferable).

Colours :

- Colour should be used to unify the poster.
- Choose 2 or 3 colours and keep them consistent.
- Use strong primary colours.
- Use colour to highlight keywords in text. However, most text should be black.

Guidelines For Poster Presentation

- Backgrounds should be plain (white is a good choice). Avoid backgrounds with patterns or gradients sometimes they do not print well.

Graphics :

- Graphics should have a resolution of at least 300dpi.
- Try to avoid using screen shots – they are usually 72 dpi – screenshots are extremely blurry when printed on a large poster.
- DO NOT make graphics larger by stretching them on the screen. They will not look good. Size and resolution must be captured at origination (i.e.: scanning at a high resolution).
- Excel graphs and clip art are okay to manipulate because they are different types of graphics than digital photos or scanned images.

Miscellaneous Suggestions :

- **SIMPLICITY IS THE KEY** Keep to the point, and don't try to cover too many things. Present only enough data to support your conclusions. On the other hand, make sure that you present sufficient data to support your conclusions.
- When you begin to make your poster, first create a list of the visuals that you would use if you were describing your project with only the visuals. Write the text after you have created the list of visuals
- Before the poster session, rehearse a brief summary of your project. Many viewers will be in a hurry and will want a quick “guided tour” of your poster. Don't be afraid to point out uncertainties in your work, this is where you may get useful feedback. Awards:

About Coimbatore

Often called as kovai city, is a popular Business Capital of Tamil Nadu state, and also a major Educational and Medical Tourism Hub in South India.

Coimbatore is the third largest city of the state, one of the most industrialized cities in Tamil Nadu, known as the textile capital of South India or the Manchester of the South India, the city is situated on the banks of the river Noyyal, Coimbatore existed even prior to the 2nd or 3rd century AD by Karikalan, the first of the early Cholas. Among its other great rulers were Rashtrakutas, Chalukyas, Pandyas, Hoysalas and the Vijayanagara kings. When Kongunadu fell to the British along with the rest of the state, its name was changed to Coimbatore and it is by this name that it is known today, in local Tamil language it is also called as Kovai.

In the rain shadow region of the Western ghats, Coimbatore enjoys a very pleasant climate all the year round, aided by the fresh breeze that flows through the 25 kms long Palakkad gap. The rich black soil of the region has contributed to Coimbatore's flourishing agriculture industry and, it is in fact the successful growth of cotton that served as a foundation for the establishment of its famous textile industry. The first textile mill came as far back as 1888 after that many textile mills were started and provided many employment opportunities within as well as neighboring Districts. The result has been a strong economy and a reputation as one of the greatest industrial cities in South India.

There are more than 25,000 small, medium, large scale industries and textile mills are situated. Coimbatore is also famous for foundry and automobile industries, manufacturing of textile industry equipment, spares, motor pump sets, wet grinders and varied engineering goods and services. The development of Hydro electricity from the Pykara Falls in the 1930 led to a cotton boom in Coimbatore.

Coimbatore serves as an entry and exit point to neighboring Kerala State and the very popular hill station of Udhagamandalam (Ooty) is 70 kms from Coimbatore. It is the disembarking point for those who want to take the Mountain train that runs from Mettupalayam just 35 kms away from Coimbatore, regular bus services also available daily from Coimbatore to Ooty and other districts, towns and major cities.

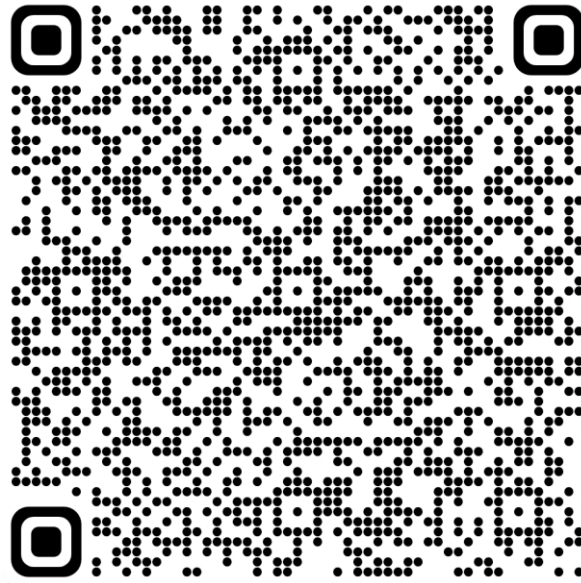
